The Man Behind the Pulpit

Christmas is right around the corner, and so I thought we might ask, "What does Christ want for Christmas?" Luckily, we don't have to wonder about the answer to that question. The Lord left his wish list for everyone to read. The answer is found in the little book of Micah.

First, the wrong answer, found in Micah chapter 6. "With what shall I come to the Lord and bow myself before the God on high? Shall I come to Him with burnt offerings, with yearling calves? Does the Lord take delight in thousands of rams, in ten thousand rivers of oil? Shall I present my firstborn for my rebellious acts, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"

The answer is no. No, I don't want that? Do you know what we call this? This is "Let's Make a Deal" religion, isn't it? God said in verse 8, "He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you? To act *justly*, and to love *mercy*, and to walk *humbly* with your God."

This year, may I suggest we start giving the God who has everything, what He wants ...not what **we** want to give!

Justice means treating people right because you know God. Mercy means loving the unlovely even when they don't love you back. Humility speaks of an attitude that is the opposite of pride. Humility does not say, "I'm a nothing, I'm a worm." That's not humility, that's self-pity, which is really another form of pride. This is humility, "God made me and I belong to him and whatever He wants I shall give!"

So what do we give the God who has everything? How about *justice*, *mercy*, and *humility*!

Gospel Connection

n reading from the book of Isaiah in the Bible, I noticed a detailed description about someone that would heal people. But why do we need to be healed?

The prophet Isaiah, who wrote approximately 700 years before Jesus was even born, said this about Him, "But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5 NASB). This prophecy foretold the suffering that Jesus would go through when He atoned for our sins on the cross. Isaiah said, "...Yet He Himself bore the sin of many..." (Isaiah 53:12b NASB).

Because we have all sinned, we are deserving of punishment. God is just and holy and must punish sinners. God is also forgiving and wants to forgive sinners. In order to reconcile us sinners to Him, and remain holy and just while at the same time forgiving, God put on flesh and became a man in the person of Jesus Christ.

Jesus went to the cross and was crucified in order to take upon Himself the wrath that we deserve. Jesus satisfied the wrath of God through His death on the cross. Jesus' payment for our sins will be applied to everyone who will repent, that is, turn from their sins, and turn to God through faith alone in Jesus Christ alone.






