





The Man Behind the Pulpit

A recent survey indicated that 58% Methodists, 60% Episcopalians, 54% Presbyterians, 35% American Baptists, 22% American Lutherans deny hell is a specific place after death. It is not difficult to understand why some choose to believe there is no such thing as eternal torment. After all, such a fact would have dramatic implications!

Christian Science believes there is no final judgment.

The Jehovah's Witnesses hold that lost men will have a second chance and that those who reject this offer of salvation will be annihilated.

And then there is sentimentalism! Rob Bell has written a book *Love Wins* - in the end universal reconciliation wins. What that means is God's love, in the end, will reconcile everyone to Himself! Sentimentalism says that a loving God could never subject anyone to such punishment.

Our Lord taught that the Holy Spirit would convince men of such judgment: "And He, when He comes, will convict the world concerning sin, and righteousness, and judgment" (John 16:8).

The writer to the Hebrews stated that this doctrine was one of the foundational truths of the faith:

Therefore leaving the elementary teaching about the Christ, let us press on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, of instruction about washings, and laying on of hands, and the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment (Hebrews 6:1-2).

Now, if you haven't noticed, all of these mainline groups share one thing in common. Do you know what it is? They have become increasingly less and less scriptural and more and more soft on sin!

A diminished view of sin cannot fathom the severity of eternal judgment. A biblical view of sin, however, necessitates a judgment beyond the grave. Since hell is not a popular subject, we are not surprised to find men resisting it and questioning how it could possibly be so. But if we are to love the lost, may I ask how can we talk about heaven if we don't talk about the hell God saved them from by His grace!

† Gospel Connection

While in Jerusalem, the apostle Peter gave a sermon in which he stated, "But God raised Him up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power" (Acts 2:24 NASB). Peter was talking about Jesus' resurrection from the dead. But why was it impossible for Jesus to be held in the power of death?

Since Jesus is God, death could not hold Jesus because of His divine power. Jesus called Himself the resurrection and the life (John 11:25).

Jesus rising from the dead shows that He has power over death. Death could not hold Jesus because it was God's divine will that Jesus be raised up (Luke 24:44-46). Jesus


has conquered death for us and will raise up all who will repent and place their faith in Jesus alone.

Because Jesus has power over death, which was demonstrated to all by His resurrection from the dead, those who are followers of Jesus have great assurance that we are also raised up with Him. The Bible says, "But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus" (Ephesians 2:4-6 NASB). Jesus has provided victory over death.
