don't know how much of the republican or democratic conventions you have watched, but one thing is clear, the United States is divided. One party likes the color blue and the other the color black. One party says blue lives matter and the other black lives matter.

My daughter and I were talking politics the other day and she said, "Dad, shouldn't all lives matter?"

The only thing I have heard thus far from both conventions that were identical were these words. "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

The Declaration of Independence: "All men are created equal." That's a true statement.

- 1. All people are equally created in God's image (Gen. 1:26-27).
- 2. All people are loved by God (John 3:16).
- 3. All people are stained and tainted by sin (Romans 3:23).
- 4. All people are able to be redeemed (Rev. 22:17).

Those four facts form the basis of the doctrine of Christian equality. All people, regardless of their background, are significant because they bare the image of their Creator, God. All men are created equal in that the God who created them loves them. All men are created equally in that all men have fallen, and all men are redeemable because the lamb of God takes away the sins of a few – no, of the world!

That's what Acts 10:34 means when it says God is no respecter of persons. He doesn't play favorites. As far as God is concerned, there are only two races: the saved race and the lost race.

Blue does not matter. Black does not matter. To God only red matters, the color of blood, the color of His Son's blood that was shed for all because all lives matter.

recently had the pleasure of visiting my brother's church, located in downtown Chicago. It is a store front church, that caters to about 2,000 people every Sunday morning. The clientele is young, due to its close proximity to the University of Illinois – Chicago, and it has a pleasant, upto-date modern feel about it. There was a praise team with a full band and all of the leaders were wearing either a sundress or a t-shirt and jeans. Even the pastor had a casual button up and dark slacks on. There was a sense of companionship and everyone there was filled with joy.

Despite the age of the clientele, the message was given with the full force of the gospel. The lead pastor was speaking that morning and was preaching about why tithing is important. He went through the God given basics, to give 10% or more of your income and that you would be blessed. While the beginning of his message may have seemed pretty standard, he quickly dived in deeper. While many pastors read you the "Bible Act" on how you should give your money, he told a story about how tithing had personally affected him. When he was 23, he was given \$1.25 in change at a local convenience store. The previous owner of the dollar had drawn a Santa Claus over top of George Washington's face making it one of a kind.

The next day, his childhood friend came over to catch up, and she told him something he would never forget. Her name was Jane and she had been a Christian her entire life. She did all the "Christian stuff" like volunteering, reading the Bible, and praying, but her life wasn't blessed until she learned how to tithe. "It was like everything changed!" she said. Suddenly nothing could stop her. Her professional, personal, and financial lives were all blessed by just giving her financial control to God.

That night as the pastor went home, he made a vow to God. He said, "God I trust you for everything else in my life, please help me relinquish this burden too." When he opened his wallet, he saw that \$1 bill and he made a vow. He promised to always keep that dollar as a symbol of how God takes care of him and to always remember to tithe.
